

## WINGS FOR CONSERVATION

**ANNUAL REPORT 2024** 



## **Background**

We imagine a world in which African wildlife and ecosystems are safe and thriving. Wings for Conservation is a Dutch Foundation using aerial support to make this vision a reality.

Since 2016, we have carried out over 100 conservation missions, flown over 1,800 flight hours, covering a distance of more than 260,000 kilometers.

We conduct flights to detect and deter illegal activities such as illegal hunting, enabling rapid response by ranger teams on the ground. We monitor wildlife movements near human settlements, helping to prevent conflicts and promote coexistence.

We collect vital data on wildlife populations and habitats, supporting conservation strategies and we conduct flights to provide strategic guidance and support for the effective management of protected areas.

## Summary

In early 2024, after more than six years of successful work in Chad, more than 80 conservation missions and the creation of a new national park, among other achievements, we relocated our operations and aircraft from Chad to Mozambique. The long ferry flight took two weeks and 50 flight hours.

In Mozambique, our aircraft flew 15 conservation missions, 104 hours and covered over 14,000 kilometers.

Our work focused mainly on the province of Maputo, in the south of the country.

We provided ongoing support to Maputo National Park, including our first coastal missions and also provided support outside of protected areas with wildlife monitoring and wildlife tagging missions, particularly of elephants in areas of human-wildlife conflict.
